Pets

Residents are increasingly reporting to us that dog owners are letting their dogs foul on communal grass areas, shared walkways and balconies in blocks of flats. This is not acceptable and causes great distress to neighbours and residents.

Dogs wandering by themselves, without their owners can be intimidating, particularly to the elderly and young children. Please do not allow your dog to roam unsupervised. The Tenancy Agreement clearly states the terms for keeping pets:

If you keep a cat or dog or any other animal in your home, you must keep them under control and not allow them to foul your home. If your home is in a block of flats, you must not allow your pet to foul any areas shared with your neighbours.

If you know of a dog fouling or wandering unsupervised on an Estate and you don't know who the owner is, we can investigate and will take action. All information will be treated in the strictest confidence. Dogs are not allowed to be exercised on council land, except in designated dog exercise areas.
